



The project is nearly finished. At left: how the garden looked on 5 April 2022, then how it is now as at 20 March 2023. The plan is that the central Capital Pear tree will eventually hide the cliff face and the garden should be easier to keep tidy.

Special thanks to <u>Theo Kolla</u> who, just a few days before Christmas and at short notice, gave up his time to lay pavers on the sea-front side of the seats. Salvia and convolvulus were then planted.

In January, poly-edging was installed to separate the different gravels; <u>Jim McIndoe</u> grabbed the sledge hammer and broke up old concrete in the garden bed before we knew what was happening!; and <u>Ed Kadlacek</u> installed new irrigation, and updated the fittings in the geranium pots. White gravel is now under the seats and edging the garden bed, and grey gravel was placed in the middle of the bed to reduce sun glare. The final task will be to pressure clean the pavers.

So, you've finally decided to get yourself that new puppy or kitten to brighten things up after the gloom of the past few years. You've seen a picture online of the cutest puppy/kitten that just has BUY ME written all over it.

Be very careful, it could be a scam.

The scam is a relatively simple one. The scammers use reputable online sales sites such as Marketplace or Gumtree, and place a photo of the cute puppy or kitten, often a purebred, but even increasingly so called 'rescue' dogs or on occasion a 'free' dog. Once you've paid for the dog, there will then be ongoing charges for transport, crates, immunisations etc, etc, etc, until you finally realise there is no puppy and the scammer will cut contact.

Once you've made contact, they'll often ask a series of questions in relation to your capacity to care for the puppy/kitten. Don't be fooled, these are purely to lull you into a false sense of security. There may well be a professional looking website with lots of pictures, This could well be a legitimate breeder's work that has been copied by the scammer, because the scammer doesn't actually have a puppy/kitten to sell to you.

How avoid being scammed -

- Do a reverse image search on the pictures in the ad. If they are attached to another site – BIG RED FLAG!
- How long has the website been online Look it up at <u>www.whois.com</u>. If it's only been online for a very short time - RED FLAG!
- For pedigreed breeds Is there a big discount for the puppy/kitten compared to what they would normally cost from a reputable Breeder? RED FLAG!
- If there is a Australian National Kennel Club or Breeder association number, look it up online and make contact though the email/phone number *listed* on the site.
- Do they have an ABN? Look it up at https://abr.business.gov.au.
- Do they have a business name? Look it up at <u>https://asic.gov.au</u>

- For 'rescues', check what shelter they belong to, and search online and call to verify that the shelter exists, and the puppy/kitten also exists.
- RED FLAG Does the breeder only wish to communicate via text or email? If they won't talk to you via phone then forget about it, probably a scam.
- Ask the breeder/seller for a video call to see the puppy/kitten and its parents. If they refuse (no matter what the reason!), then BIG RED FLAG!

There are sites online dedicated to recording the scam websites, but these are not always up to date. Usually once they have been registered on a site like that, the scammer shuts it down and changes its name and starts again. But, they do contain lots of information about how to recognise a scam.

So what happens when you send your money to a scammer? Usually you will have transferred the money via Bank Transfer into account details provided by the scammer. This account will sometimes be in the name of a victim of identity theft or an account sold off by a departing temporary Australian resident. The money will then likely be moved on into a Crypto currency account, making it impossible to trace. Within minutes, your money is gone, often to the other side of the world, long before there is any chance for the bank to freeze it or for law enforcement to retrieve it.

It's very much a case of BUYER BEWARE!

This month saw the culmination of quite a bit of planning to educate our volunteers in the local district. A grant enabled us to hire local bus tour – Teague Tours – to do a field trip. 16 Volunteers headed from Port Vincent towards Sultana Point, checking out the Clan Ranald graves and the mosaic trail along the way. While the road was a bit rough, the trek along Wattle Point road gave people an excellent view of the wind farm and a good look around the Wattle Point campgrounds, which is a very protected small campsite right on the coast.

We then went via the wind farm viewing area to Weaners Flat reserve for a spot of morning tea (thanks Gypsy Bakes), then off to Pink Lake and Pink Lake Cemetery. Gabrielle Gutsche from YP Tourism gave an excellent documentary along the way, because local knowledge is what tourists seek, and what this trip was all about providing.

Off to Ballara – never heard of it? A great little art centre at Warooka that has lots of workshops and performances to broaden what can sometimes be a narrow outlook.

The next campsite was Minlacowie – a very different campsite from Wattle Point. Open and flat with a great beach, and a reef which makes snorkeling a real treat.

Watsacowie finished our tour, with a talk from Roxanne about the evolution of a brewery right here in the barley capital of the world.

Everyone enjoyed, but more importantly, learnt a lot from the day, and from each other. This knowledge will be used over the next month as Easter and School Holidays see an influx of tourists looking for things to do. So – how many of those places have YOU visited? Why not be a tourist in your own town?

It's important our volunteers not only have knowledge of what is available to see and do on the peninsula, but have a passion and excitement about those activities, and this bus tour certainly provided both knowledge and passion.

Have you signed the local Health petition?

We need 3,000 more signatures!

We have reached the 7,000 signatures mark of our petition calling for improvements to local health services in the Narungga electorate and need 3,000 more to reach the 10,000 signatures target that is required to formally trigger Parliamentary action.

If you are over 18 and haven't yet signed the petition and are interested in doing so, please call into my office to sign, or call or email and we can post or email out a petition sheet or provide information about how and where you can provide your signature. Any businesses who have run out of sheets or have completed sheets are also asked to make contact and we can arrange to provide more sheets or collect sheets (note completed sheets cannot be emailed back as the sheets must be in original form to meet Parliament's Standing Orders so they need to be hand delivered or posted back to us).

The petition specifically seeks better resourcing of our local health services and action to address the GP shortages that so many of us are gravely concerned about and which are threatening the future of regional townships.

In some good health news, it is fantastic that SA Health now has appointed a dedicated stoma nurse for Yorke Peninsula, with local clinics now running four days a week – two at Wallaroo, and one at Maitland and one at Yorketown. By all accounts, the more than 100 people in our region requiring this regular treatment are extremely happy with this outcome.

<u>Five Ways To Keep Your Dog Safe On Our Beaches</u> <u>Brought to you by Dr Lyndall Short – Vet 2 You at Port Vincent</u>

1. Keep your dog on a lead.

Unfortunately as vets, we see all too often the effects of dogs being off a lead down at the beach. Emergencies such as dog fights, cut feet on razor fish, or fish hooks located in all sorts of places, are frequent calls for our emergency team. Keeping control of your dog by having them on a lead will prevent most of these situations.

2. Provide shade and be sun safe.

A few times a year we will see dogs that have overheated at the beach; known as heatstroke. This can happen even if it is not in the heat of the day, as dogs have difficulty getting rid of the extra heat they have accumulated throughout the day. If you are at the beach for an extended period, take a shade and make sure your dog is protected from the sun and has fresh, cool water available. To avoid sunburn, also consider applying an appropriate pet friendly sunscreen, especially for those dogs with a lack of pigment over the bridge of their nose.

3. Provide fresh water.

Dogs need to have fresh water after a swim. Occasionally dogs can ingest salt water when they are swimming, and diluting this as much as possible with fresh water is essential to avoid them becoming unwell. It is a good idea to also rinse off the salt water from their coat to prevent itchiness, and dry off their skin to reduce the risk of sand causing irritation to the eyes and skin.

4. Don't let them eat anything on the beach.

Dead fish on the beach are really attractive to dogs. Port Vincent and other areas of the Yorke Peninsula are known to have puffer fish. Ingesting a puffer fish can cause life threatening paralysis if not treated promptly. If you see your dog has eaten a dead fish on the beach, *please call our team immediately.*

5. Only let them in the water if you are confident they can swim, and consider a life jacket.

Every year we have a small number of dogs that chase seagulls into deep water. This can be a very dangerous situation as some dogs aren't good swimmers. It can result in swallowing water, or even worse – saltwater going into the lungs. If this happens to your dog, please *contact our emergency staff so we can help.*

The good news is if you have an emergency, you can call Vet 2 You during opening hours on 8853 7273, or 0458 730 751 after hours.



Mobile Network Extension Devices Pilot Program

Key dates: Expressions of interest can be submitted now, and installations are already underway.

The pilot program is open until 30 June 2023, or when funding is exhausted.

Program details: The \$10 million South Australian Mobile Phone Black Spot Fund was established to leverage Australian Government funding and work with telecommunications providers to maximise investment to address mobile black spots across the state.

The Government of South Australia is investing \$748,000 in the Mobile Network Extension Devices Pilot Program. Telstra

GO Repeaters improve mobile coverage by amplifying the network signal received by the mobile device.

The program will subsidise the cost of installing a Telstra GO Repeater for people who live or own a small business in

eligible council areas, including Yorke Peninsula.

Residents and business owners can contact Telstra to discuss the best solution for their location.

Participants can purchase a Telstra GO Repeater outright, or through a monthly payment option and apply directly to Telstra for subsidised installation.

Professional installation by Telstra will be required to access the subsidy.

Devices can only be used by customers on the Telstra Mobile Network.

How to apply

Telstra are taking expressions of interest, and installation of the mobile repeater can take place once an appropriate

solution has been agreed upon.



Funerals


The clubrooms were used by two families during March, following the respective passings of Elaine Golding and Graham Cowell. The PVMBC expresses its condolences to both families and their friends.
