YORKE PENINSULA COUNCIL UPDATE



Yorke Peninsula Council extends Season's Greetings and a Happy New Year to all residents and visitors enjoying Port Vincent this summer.

After an extremely busy year, including at Port Vincent, we wish to provide updates about various important happenings within the town.

Self-service fuel outlet

It is fantastic to see the opening of the new self-service fuel outlet for Port Vincent (at the former BP site).

Council's support for this project has included planning advice which allowed for siteworks to commence immediately.

Additionally, Council is working on options to assist with repairs/replacement of public infrastructure that is expected to be impacted by the development.

Doctor's rooms

Council is aware of the intent to create doctors' consulting rooms in Port Vincent, and is supportive of this proposal.

Council has offered the developer a possible temporary site in a Council-owned building to support a service whilst the proposed development is being designed.

Staff have also partnered with the Port Vincent Pharmacist to apply for a grant to allow for the construction of a new purpose-built doctor's surgery. If successful, this grant will provide a significant financial contribution toward the project.

To date, Council's planning department has not received any application or request for advice in relation to this proposed development.

Port Vincent Wharf

The Port Vincent fisherman's wharf is a State-owned asset that Council has diverted significant funds to repairing in the past financial year.

Council endorsed a pause on jetties expenditure in March 2023, pending the State Government's completion of condition assessment reports for all 12 State-owned jetties under Council's Care and Control.

The State Government is reviewing these reports and it is appropriate for Council to then review the most recent structural inspection reports, and, in consultation with State Government, prioritise works under the SA Jetties Renewal Program.

Engineering for sea wall

To address beach erosion, staff are arranging quotes to have an engineered design for a wall.

This will be a requirement for a development application and ultimately approval from the Coastal Protection Board for any works undertaken. It is the same process that was required for Stansbury.

In the meantime, Council staff are inspecting and making safe any areas that could be problematic.

Caravan Storage

Council is committed to continuing the longstanding Caravan Storage Yard in Port Vincent.

With the park having experienced record visitation in the past couple of years, it is no longer efficient for the Park Managers to provide a towing service. As such, the Park is now permitting van owners (and/or their delegated representatives) to tow their own vehicles to and from the storage yard.

Demand for caravan storage has remained high since this change, with numerous new van/boat owners taking up positions in the storage yard – all with the understanding they'll be required to tow themselves.

Additionally, Council is working with Port Vincent Progress on an outcome by which Progress can operate the storage yard. Money earned from storage fees will then go to Progress for improvements in Port Vincent, as opposed to the traditional arrangement where most profits went to Council (for general coffers to be spent across the entire Yorke Peninsula region) and to the Park Managers.

Cormorants

Addressing the issues caused by cormorants is complex, and is a long term project for Council and a number of other stakeholders including the State Government, local businesses and the community.

In the immediate term, Council actively undertakes a cormorant control program under permit from the Department of Environment and Water. Further to this program, Council recently engaged Ecosure to develop a Pied Cormorant Management Strategy (adopted by Council in 2023) which will guide the long-term management of the cormorants.

Staff work diligently to ensure any cormorants are removed from the ground after each round of the control program. However, if any have been missed, please contact Council and staff will remove them as soon as possible.

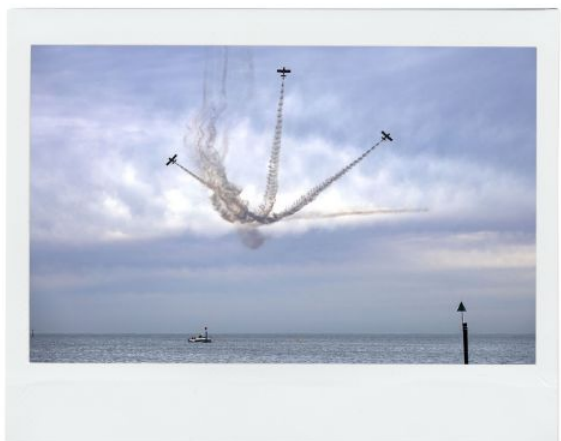
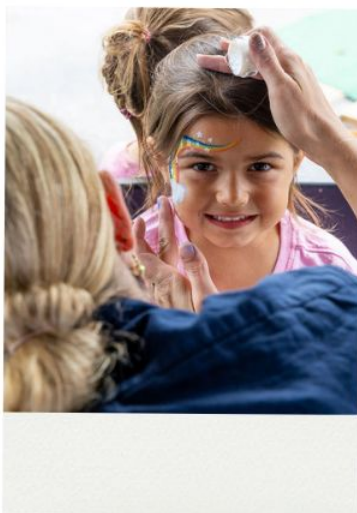

Happy New Year 2024!

Welcome to the new year, and a special welcome to the many visitors who enjoy our wonderful patch of the world here on Yorke Peninsula during the summer holidays.

There were many highlights in 2023 for our office, a major one being lodging the health petition in the chamber on 15 November and surpassing the required 10,000 signatures to trigger a formal review by the Legislative Review Committee into the five specific requests petitioned.

I await the response from the Legislative Review Committee, and details of the type and terms of reference of the review that is to now occur.

Concerns about our health system were further compounded mid-November with the announced temporary closure of Ardrossan Hospital's Accident and Emergency Unit. Discussions with SA Health and the Yorke and Northern Local Health Network are continuing about the future of this service, and before the Christmas break I additionally raised the topic in the chamber and with the Minister. I expect to know more soon on this topic.

Whilst health is a predominant concern, so are roads needing maintenance and upgrades, rising costs of living, coast infrastructure and environmental damage, jetty funding and mobile phone black spots, just to name a few topics.

Of the latter, it is pleasing a new Telstra tower is imminent for Edithburgh. However, more must be done proactively by governments to fix black spots as mobile phone coverage is not a luxury, it is an essential tool for business, community safety and regional service delivery.

I encourage all to continue to contact my office nominating unsafe roads and poor phone reception areas, and to discuss any State issue. Re SYP roads, my wish list for next year includes slip lanes for Hardwicke Bay and Port Vincent and an upgrade of the Yorketown to Edithburgh road.

Grants

Currently open grant programs include the Youth Mental Health Fund, two Veterans SA funds, Grants for Seniors and the new SA Football Facilities Fund. Please visit www.fraserellis.com.au (refer Grants tab) for further information and application forms.

Summer Food Safety

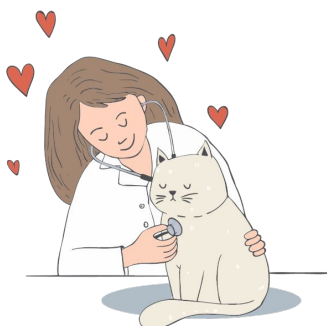
Summer is a great time to have a BBQ and do some entertaining, with longer daylight hours and warmer weather. Naturally, our four-legged family members love to be involved, so here are a few tips to keep them safe.

A common illness, and potentially fatal condition we see as a result of pets at BBQ's is pancreatitis. Pancreatitis is the term for inflammation of the pancreas which can be caused by eating foods high in fat such as sausages, cooked meat, table scraps etc. Pancreatitis is very painful and needs to be treated early. The symptoms of pancreatitis include vomiting, lethargy, abdominal pain, high temperature, diarrhoea and dehydration. The symptoms of pancreatitis can become critical, and even fatal, very quickly. So, if you suspect your pet may have pancreatitis you should seek veterinary attention immediately. Additionally, meat and fat can cause gastrointestinal upset resulting in vomiting and diarrhoea.

Bones can be a big problem for our pets, potentially causing fractured teeth, choking and obstructions in the digestive systems, which can lead to constipation. Pets should not be fed cooked bones as they can splinter easily and cause obstructions in the gastrointestinal tract, possibly tearing the intestinal wall which is life threatening. Smaller bones can become stuck in an animal's throat and oesophagus. For these reasons, we do not recommend feeding your dogs bones.

There are several foods that are toxic to our pets. Some of these foods include:-

- Chocolate
- Onions and garlic
- Grapes/sultanas/raisins
- Avocados
- Nuts
- Xylitol (artificial sugars)



Make sure your bin are firmly closed, and dispose of rubbish securely to prevent your pet from eating rubbish. Some dogs can accidentally eat skewers which can result in the oesophagus, stomach or their intestines being pierced. Corn cobs can get stuck in the intestines, leading to the need for emergency surgery. Also be aware of grease drippings. Sometimes if grease is on loose gravel, pets will actually eat the stones covered in the grease. If these are swallowed, they can get stuck in your pet's digestive tract.

Also of danger is fishing equipment. Some pets will try to eat fish hooks/baits, causing obstructions and hooks getting caught in their mouths. Please store and dispose of fishing equipment safely.

**If your pet has accidentally eaten the above foods/equipment,
please contact Vet 2 You on 8853 7273.**

If the item was eaten recently, we can potentially induce vomiting to remove the object quickly, and hopefully avoid more dire/toxic effects. 13

King George are still being caught by those who have the time to put in to search for them. Squid are also still around.

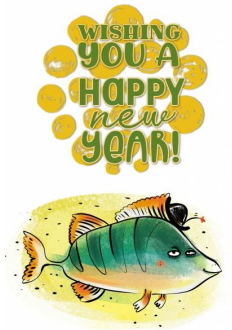
There are still tommies at the wharf, and crabs are also available for drop netters.

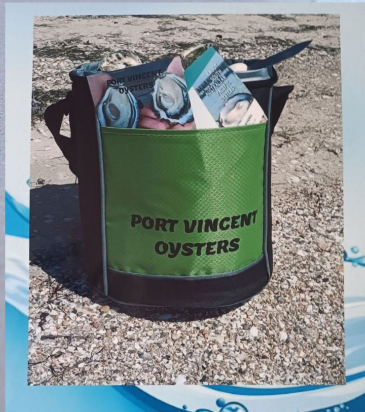

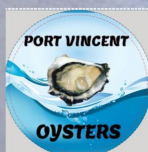

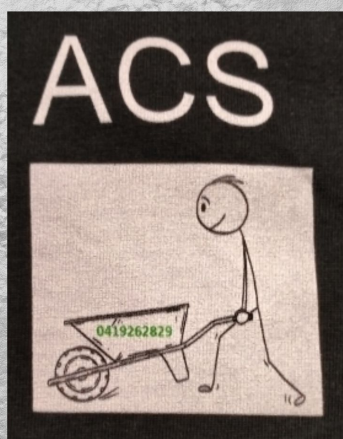

Controlling rabbits in urban areas



You're invited to attend one of three community workshops in Yorke Peninsula to learn about controlling feral rabbits in your township.

Have you noticed more feral rabbits lately? Rabbits wreak havoc on the environment, stripping vegetation in gardens and parks, causing soil erosion and competing with native animals for food and habitat. They can also cause significant damage to infrastructure by burrowing under buildings.

Summer is the best time to control feral rabbits as a lack of green feed and hot conditions help to reduce rabbit numbers and the next season's breeding stock.

The Northern and Yorke Landscape Board is hosting three 2-hour workshops to help property owners learn control methods, ideal timing and tactics, and how to work with your neighbours for the best outcome.

Greenleaf Australia presenter Jim Donnelly will share information about:

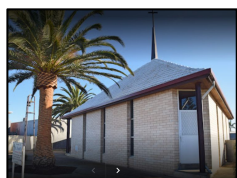

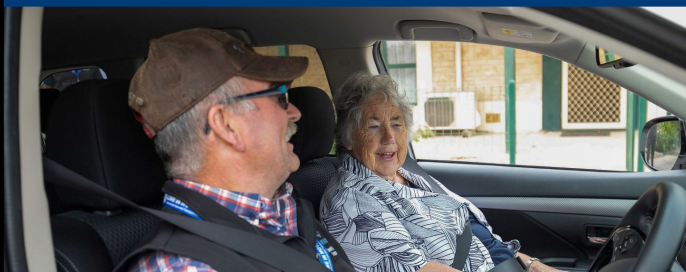

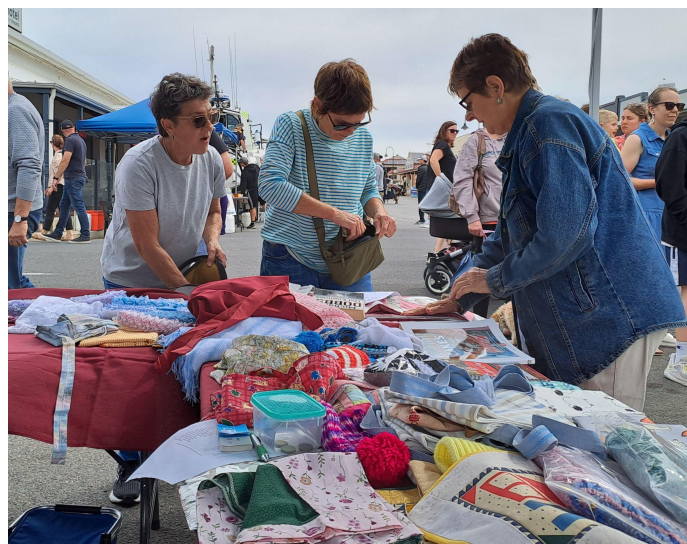
