INQUIRY ON THE DELIVERY OF HEALTH SERVICES ON THE YORKE PENINSULA CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS

The Economic and Finance Parliamentary Standing Committee has been referred the Eligible Petition 45. Narungga Rural and Regional Health Care. The Economic and Finance Committee has resolved to inquire into and report on the delivery of health services on the Yorke Peninsula and specifically investigate:

- (1) the classification of the Wallaroo Hospital;
- (2) the most appropriate Local Health Network coverage of the Port Pirie Hospital;
- (3) factors impacting the delivery of health services on the Yorke Peninsula and especially in relation to access and equity; and
- (4) any other matter relating to health services on the Yorke Peninsula.

Our new building offers a home-away-from-home for regional cancer patients and their carers while they access treatments and cancer related appointments in the Adelaide area. The building offers the most up to date accommodation alongside a range of on-site support services, including Social Workers, Transport to Treatment, kitchen and dining areas and a range of inviting and welcoming communal spaces. Please note, guests must be able to either look after themselves or be accompanied by a carer, as we are unable to provide personal or nursing care.

Canine Parvovirus

As there is an increased number of Parvovirus cases in recent weeks, we wanted to give you some information regarding this scary virus.

What is canine parvovirus?

Parvovirus or canine parvovirus (commonly known as parvo) is a very contagious virus that affects unvaccinated/partially vaccinated dogs, with puppies at the greatest risk.

How does it affect our dogs?

Parvo causes severe vomiting and diarrhoea, often containing blood as it attacks the small intestine. The vomiting and diarrhoea causes severe dehydration, shock and death. It also attacks the bone marrow, damaging it, so they can no longer make enough white blood cells to fight off the infection, adding to the severity.

How do they become affected?

Parvo is highly contagious and can live in the environment for long periods of time. It can be resistant to routine cleaning and weather changes. It is shed in the faeces of infected dogs and can easily come into contact when your dog is sniffing the ground on walks. Direct dog-to-dog contact is not required for a dog to become infected and for the infection to spread. It is easily transferable from the ground to people's shoes, dog's paws and bedding, etc.

What are the symptoms?

Gastrointestinal symptoms are the most obvious signs, which include:-

- Loss of appetite
 - Vomitina
- Diarrhea (which may contain blood)
- Fever or low body temperature
- Lethargy
- Abdominal pain and bloating

How to protect your pet?

Vaccinations are the only way to protect your pet from contracting parvo. Annual vaccinations (or tri-annual) are required to keep your pet up to date. Puppies require 3 vaccinations to be full covered. The schedule is as follows:-

1st vaccination 6-8 weeks, 2nd vaccination 10- 12 weeks, 3rd (final) 14-16 weeks.

Puppies are not fully covered until 2 weeks after their final vaccination. We recommend to wait until then before socialising in public areas, parks, beaches, etc, and also with dogs with an unknown vaccination status.

Parvo is a very severe infection and can be fatal. Please protect your family and the community by vaccinating and disposing of your pet's faeces on walks to reduce environmental contamination.



Health Petition Inquiry is open – lodge a submission

The SA Parliament's Economic and Finance Committee late last year called for submissions to the formal Inquiry into our health services that was by law, triggered by the lodging of our petition in 2023 with its near 11,000 signatures.

So, whilst it has been some two and a half years since we launched our health petition, finally we have the outcome we aimed for – a formal Inquiry by the Parliament and a valuable opportunity to have our say and ultimately, instigate system change!

This wonderful outcome would not have been possible without the support of a lot of community-minded people across the Narungga electorate who signed and circulated sheets and did so purely because they care about country health care.

It was the largest petition ever undertaken in our electorate's history, and to have it referred to the Parliament's Economic and Finance Committee for investigation is also a ground-breaking first.

The next, vital step is to lodge as many submissions to the Inquiry as possible. Regional hospitals must be relied upon to provide appropriate care, and Wallaroo Hospital especially, being our growing region's major facility, desperately needs an upgrade and more beds and staff to better support associated hospitals including Maitland and Yorketown.

I encourage all who have had interaction with our local health – good or bad – to make a submission; closing date to have submissions in is 7 February 2025 (5 pm). It is hoped this timing will also capture the attention of our thousands of visitors who holiday with us who I'm aware are also passionate about local health service delivery.

Inundating the committee with submissions will appropriately reflect the unprecedented, high and wide level of community concern felt about local health services.

The action we take now is in support of our hard-working doctors, nurses and volunteer ambos who are under the pump in a stretched system in dire need of additional resourcing; and is also for all who reside in our region who need and deserve the reassurance of having an appropriate level of health services at hand when needed.

Well, a new year is here, and despite all of my (and other's) pleading for fishers to not take undersized crabs, the photo below was given to me by a Port Vincent resident. It quite clearly shows undersize blue crabs have been taken (the shells were found on the beach). I hope that this wasn't done by a member of our community, but whoever is responsible, I have two pieces of advice. Sooner or later you will get caught, and secondly, do not come back to Port Vincent as we do not want you here.

Now for the fishing report. Garfish are as thick as I have seen them for a long time. It is easy to catch a feed from the shore as well as

from the boat.

King George are around, but not in big numbers, and you may have to make a few shifts to get a feed.

Blue crabs are a little quiet, but should pick up again in the coming weeks.

Yellowfin have not appeared in any numbers, but a few hot days should see them improve.

Squid have slowed down, but a feed is still obtainable if you put in the time.


