#### <u>LETTERS TO THE EDITOR - please email afocalpoint@portvincent.org.au</u>

I am a member of the YP Ratepayers' committee. As such, I have been sending letters to the YP Country Times expressing dissatisfaction with several aspects of YP Council's policy and procedures. Although this is only a small gesture coming from an individual, it has been part of a larger strategy to raise public awareness of their maladministration.

An email concerning an official YP Ratepayer formal request for a review of the recent rates increases is (in part) below. The actual request can be accessed by clicking "Here is a copy" in the email below. It pulls no punches. I think you will find it a most satisfactory response. If you are not already a member of the Ratepayers Association- *please join*.

In addition, I have (as part of the strategy) written separately to the Minister for Local Government and the Shadow Minister protesting about aspects of S270, and in particular, about the abuse of its provisions in the Mayor's treatment of legitimate queries (called "Reviews") previously submitted by conscientious councillors and rate payers. This "abuse" results in requests for reviews never making it to the Council meetings, and others are tabled but treated with contempt. This is only one aspect we are concerned about. You will note that the Ratepayers Association formal letter mentioned above is another such request for a review. We wait to see how it is treated. It is very powerful. I think you will agree.

On behalf of Yorke Peninsula ratepayers, we have recently submitted a S270 request for a review of the rate increase decision made by Council on the 10th of July, 2024. We feel that how this decision was made, may not comply with the requirements of local government legislation. Here is a copy of what was submitted, both to the CEO of the Council and copied to all of the Councilors, so they are aware that it has been sent. Please send a copy of this document to all of the people in your network. Please ask them to: -

A Yorke Peninsula Council spokesperson supplied the following in response to a request from the A Focal Point:-

"Thank you to the A Focal Point for offering Council right of reply to the letters to the editor in this edition.

Council can confirm that rates were increased by 4.8 per cent for residential and commercial properties on average. If rates for your home or business rose by more than 4.8 per cent, that means someone else's rates increased by less or in some cases even stayed the same/decreased. This all depends on your property valuation – which is determined not by Council but by the independent Valuer General. Primary Production ratepayers experienced higher rate increases than home and business owners et cetera. This reflects the continuing increases in value for farmland. Even after this latest rate rise, Yorke Peninsula Council Primary Producers continue to pay the lowest rates of any farmers in the wider region, less than half what is paid in the Copper Coast. For residential, commercial and primary production properties, Council reduced the rate-in-the-dollar charged. This was to soften the blow of rising property values for our ratepayers.

The rating process used is currently subject to a Section 270 Review and therefore Council cannot offer comment."

## **CORMORANT EXCREMENT IS A HEALTH HAZARD**

Cormorant excrement has become a significant health hazard at the BBQ areas near the wharf. It is posing risks due to its bacteria and foul odour. The buildup on the public tables was recently addressed by our Tidy Towns volunteers. As you can see from the photos below, it was certainly not an easy task! They literally spent hours removing the distasteful mess from the tables and chairs.

YP Council has performed Scare Shoots over past months, but unfortunately the cormorants return to the area within days of these shoots. A suggestion was made to remove our beautiful and significant trees from the area. However, it has been pointed out that the problem will just move elsewhere in Port Vincent if that occurs.

The excrement from the cormorants is extremely acidic and not only deteriorates the environment, but also endangers the health of those who frequent these spaces.

It's crucial for you, the public, to voice your concerns by writing to the council, urging them to address the issue and find effective solutions for this ongoing problem.

A huge thank you to the Tidy Towns volunteers who cleaned the tables and chairs, and also to our YP Council for loaning them the pressure sprayer (which was definitely required).

We are very fortunate to have two Telstra Free Payphones in Port Vincent (one is opposite the Port Vincent Motel and Apartments on Main Street and the other is opposite the Foreshore Caravan Park on Marine Parade).

Unfortunately, during the recent school holidays, someone used the telephone opposite the motel as a toilet!

Using a public telephone box as a toilet shows a complete disregard for public property and the community that shares it. Such behavior not only vandalises shared spaces, but also creates an unsanitary and unpleasant experience for others who might need to use the phone. Individuals who act in this way demonstrate a lack of respect for their surroundings as well as the efforts made to maintain public amenities.

Fortunately, our town had two volunteers who were prepared to remove the mess created by these unsavoury individuals. *A huge thank you to these two men who cleaned the mess.* Photos of the sickening incident are below.

I know payphones are also a lifeline for thousands of vulnerable Australians – the homeless, the isolated, those escaping domestic violence – and often provide their only link to critical support services and those that care about them.

In 2022 Australians made 11 million calls on payphones, including more than 230,000 calls to vital services like Triple Zero, so there's no doubt payphones are already often the lifeline that's there when it's needed most.

Telstra's purpose is to build a connected future so everyone can thrive. To deliver on this ambition we want to contribute to a better, more caring and more inclusive Australia, an Australia where people can reach out for help if and when they need to, or just connect if they feel like it.

The payphone network that we've been maintaining since the 1880s is a key part of that, and I'm



Well, the crab season has started, and from what I have seen, it is a great start! There are plenty to be had by netting and raking. But, once again, take a measure and only gather what you need.




November is a month that winds down to Advent and to Christmas. It also brings the Christmas Pageant, the Melbourne Cup and cricket.


