"Cost of Living" community forums September 7

With so many individuals and families dealing with very stretched household budgets due to rising food costs, power bills and high rents and interest rates, I have arranged for two local information forums to be held – one at Minlaton and another at Wallaroo.

Both forums are to be held on Thursday 7 September, the Wallaroo one in the morning and an afternoon session at Minlaton in the afternoon. Guest speakers will be representatives from the Department of Human Services, the Department of Energy and Mining, and from Uniting Country SA and topics will include government concessions and subsidies, how to understand and reduce power bills, and budgeting advice. 

To Summarise All the Scam Watch advice, here are some Golden Rules for SCAM avoidance:-

- NEVER allow anybody else to access your online banking. Not friends, not family, not random strangers on the phone/internet.
- NEVER click on links in texts advising that your accounts/Paypal/Amazon have been fraudulently accessed. Ring your bank/financial institution directly if you are concerned. Banks will NEVER put a link in a legitimate text advising you of suspect activity.
- DO NOT transfer your money to an account opened by someone you have only spoken to on the phone to 'keep it safe'. Vast sums can be lost that way.
- NEVER allow anyone to remotely access your computer/phone/tablet. Don't install software on your device at someone else's direction unless you are 100% sure of their identity. A random somebody claiming to be from your bank is not that person!
- Set up two factor authentication on your accounts, learn how it works and NEVER provide the authentication codes to anyone else.
- Treat with great, huge, massive suspicion (am I making the point here?!), any calls or Facebook ads that tell you that you can make easy money by investing in share trading/crypto. They lie!! If you wish to invest, research a legitimate share trading/investment platform.
- If you are buying/selling online in forums such as Gumtree/Marketplace, contact your bank and learn about Payld. It's a scam prevention tool that is worth knowing about. DO NOT let someone online "help" you to do this. PayID is FREE, don't let anyone tell you differently.
- If you use online selling forums, be very careful about payments. Screen shots of payment details should be treated like mirages. Check your own account before releasing goods.
- Pet Scams are highly prevalent. Contact breeders' associations to find legitimate breeders.
- Never transfer money to random Bank Accounts as a result of receiving a text message from a supposed loved one who has lost a phone or left a card at home. Hey Mum, **it's A SCAM**!
- Transferring a large sum to a third party you don't commonly transact with? Make a phone call to check the payment details on any emailed invoice. This prevents email interception scams.
- Romance scams the hardest of all to prevent. We all want to be loved, and love can be blind (and deaf and wilfully self-deceptive). But, if your new online romantic interest starts asking for money, then you deserve better. Move on to someone who genuinely wants you, and is not just saying what you want to hear to get your money.
- Be Scam Aware The weak link in any protection system is likely to be a human being ... By staying aware, you reduce the chances of losing your money.

INFORMATION FOR COMMUNITY GROUPS - FOOD SAFETY

The Progress Association has been provided with information regarding new regulations for the handling/supplying of food by Not for Profit groups.

There are different tiers of the qualifications required, and these are dependent on how often food is served, etc.

If required, a supervisor may have to be on site any time any food is being prepared, and then anyone helping to prepare the food will need to have completed the online course (the link is below). https://dofoodsafely.health.vic.gov.au/index.php/en/

It is probably appropriate that each individual community group contacts the Environmental Health Officer at the Yorke Peninsula Council to understand the specific requirements as apparently <u>it won't be a one size fits all situation</u>.



PORT VINCENT'S BUTTERFLIES



Port Vincent boasts a rich biodiversity of butterflies that play a vital role in the local ecosystem. The region's unique combination of coastal landscapes, native vegetation, and diverse microclimates has given rise to a variety of butterfly species, each contributing to the delicate balance of the environment.

Among the many species found here, the Common Brown (Heteronympha merope) stands out. With its intricate patterns and earthy tones, this butterfly is a common sight in the area's grasslands and meadows. Its caterpillars feed on native grasses, which helps maintain the health of these grasslands and promotes the growth of other native plants.

The Cabbage White (Pieris rapae), though introduced, has established a significant presence in Port Vincent. While often considered a pest due to its preference for cruciferous crops, this butterfly also contributes to the local ecosystem. Its nectar-feeding habits make it an important pollinator for various flowering plants, thus aiding in plant reproduction and promoting overall biodiversity.

The presence of the Imperial Hairstreak (Jalmenus evagoras) adds a touch of iridescent beauty to the local butterfly population. This species has a unique ecological role, forming mutualistic relationships with ants. Their caterpillars secrete a sugary substance that ants feed on, while the ants, in turn, protect the caterpillars from predators. This delicate interaction underscores the intricate web of relationships that define the environment.

The Small and Large Grass Yellow (Eurema spp.) butterflies, with their bright yellow wings, are frequently observed fluttering around Port Vincent. These butterflies serve as both pollinators and indicators of ecosystem health. Their presence reflects the availability of suitable host plants and nectar sources, giving researchers and conservationists insights into the overall well-being of the local environment.

The impact of these butterflies on the Port Vincent environment is multifaceted. Their role as pollinators contributes to the reproduction of various plant species, which, in turn, supports other wildlife and the health of the ecosystem. Additionally, the interactions between butterflies and their host plants help regulate plant populations and maintain a balanced ecosystem.

However, like many species worldwide, the butterfly populations of Port Vincent face challenges. Habitat loss, climate change, and pesticide use can disrupt their delicate interactions and threaten their survival. Conservation efforts that focus on preserving native vegetation, creating butterfly-friendly habitats, and raising awareness about the importance of these insects can contribute to their continued presence in the region.

From pollination to plant population control, these delicate creatures contribute to the intricate web of life in this coastal landscape. Their presence reminds us of the interconnectedness of all species and the need to safeguard their habitats for the well-being of both the butterflies and the ecosystem they call home.
